## RESEARCH INTERESTS

Philosophy of action (esp. free will and moral responsibility), metaphysics (esp. powers, causation, personhood), ethics (esp. meta-ethics), and epistemology

My PhD thesis defends the claim that free agency involves the exercise of an irreducible, spontaneous, 'two-way' mental power to choose how to act. The view that emerges amounts to a non-causal libertarian account of free agency, is volitionist in character, and is built upon a neo-Aristotelian, substance-powers metaphysics. In many respects, this thesis develops and defends an overall framework advanced in recent years by E.J. Lowe.
